## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE TRANSITIONAL CARE PROGRAM AT THE JEWISH HOME OF ROCHESTER**

### ***Who is eligible for services of the Transitional Care Program?***

- Applicants are eligible to become a patient on the Transitional Care Program if:
- Applicant has had a three-day inpatient hospital stay
- Applicant has had a significant decline in functional abilities and/or a skilled nursing need
- Applicant has had a safe discharge plan in place to follow a rehabilitative stay
- Applicant has the ability and desire to participate in an intensive rehabilitation program

### ***Is the cost covered by insurance?***

Provided a person meets the eligibility requirements listed above, the cost of a stay in the Weinberg Manson Transitional Care Program is covered by Medicare, Medicaid, Blue Cross/Blue Shield and a variety of additional insurance carriers and Medicare HMOs, including Preferred Care and Medicare Blue Choice.

### ***How are patients referred to the Transitional Care Program?***

Your hospital social worker will ask you for a list of places you would like to go for your transitional care services, in order of your preference. The social worker will then make a referral to the Weinberg Manson Transitional Care Program if you have included us on your list of preferences.

### ***May I and/or my family visit the Weinberg Manson Transitional Care Program and the Jewish Home?***
