

## WORTH SEEING

A 97-year-old artist at the Jewish Home of Rochester will have a painting exhibit this winter at the home's **Resident Art Gallery**.

Faye Faber grew up in Worcester, Mass., where she cultivated a taste for painting at the Worcester Museum of Art. She graduated from high school at age 14 and earned a master's degree in history from Clark University at 18. She married New York City doctor Harry Rosenblum in 1939 and they raised three children in Sturbridge, Mass. (Her daughter Linda is an English professor at RIT and married to RPO cellist Don Reinfeld.)

When Harry and Faye moved to Los Angeles in 1956, she took art classes and began painting, sculpting and making jewelry. Harry died in 1989 and Faye married businessman James Faber. She moved to Rochester following his death and in 2007 entered the Jewish Home, where she is a student of noted painter Jack Wolsky.
