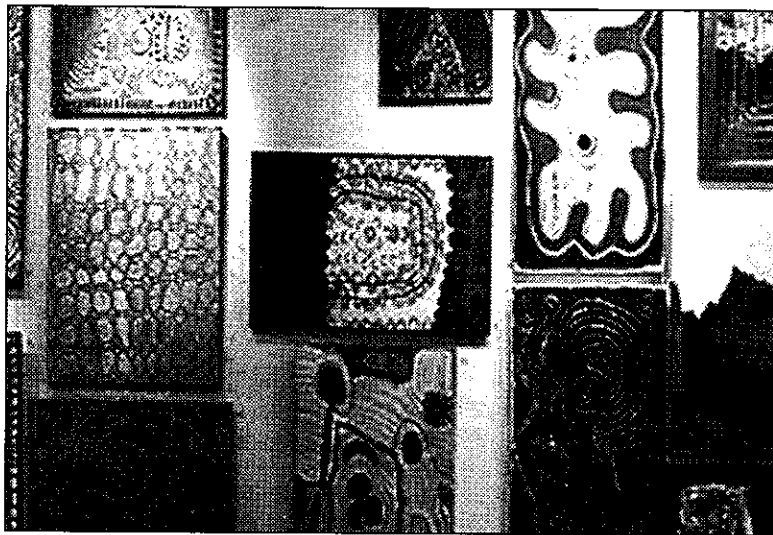


Jewish Senior Life to Host Art Exhibit

their artistic submissions, five of which will be included in the traveling art exhibit. The Jewish Home is honored these winners in a celebration May 27 when the show opened at the Home.

The Exhibit is free and open to the public at the Jewish Home, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., through June 17. ★
